

Bible Exhibition Scotland







Background

Bible Exhibition Scotland was compiled and built over 20 years ago by a group of Christians. The objective from start to finish is to impress on people the importance and relevance of the Bible to modern day lives.

Since it has begun the Bible Exhibition has travelled many miles throughout the British Isles, from the islands of Shetland to Jersey, Scotland, England, N.Ireland, S.Ireland and Wales. During this time over 400 000 children have experienced the Exhibition. All the workers have been working with children for many years and are fully disclosed.

In 2016 we launched our brand new exhibition which is a lot brighter and looks very modern and appealing.

Content

The Exhibition is divided into 4 sections. These are:

- 1. Who is God?
- 2. What is the Bible?
- 3. Where did the Bible come from ?
- 4. What's in the Bible ?
- 5. Why should the bible be important to me?

One of the great points about the Bible Exhibition is it relevance to the Christianity strand of RME in the curriculum. The Bible Exhibition itself covers some of these topics:

- · Life of Jesus
- · Miracles
- Parables
- · Famous Christians
- Bible Characters
- Lessons found in the Bible
- · The Passover
- Death and Burial of Jesus

Audience

We would suggest that primary six and seven ages are most suited, as well as first and second year of secondary school. Ideal class sizes should not exceed 30 children if possible.

Usually in the course of a day, around 3 to 4 classes would be able to visit the Exhibition depending on travelling distance, lunch and finishing times of individual schools.

The Experience

Your children will be collected by bus or you are free to walk (within reason!) Upon arrival children will be fully briefed and receive a clipboard and pencil ready for their tour.

Each class will be divided into smaller groups and your guide will conduct them round. As they go they need to listen, interact and answer the questions on their clipboard.

Each tour lasts for 50 minutes (approx.). After which they will be given refreshments and have a bit of fun to test their memories in a very competitive quiz! On leaving the exhibition each child will receive an exit pack containing: pencil, bookmark, free bible offer and other things.

All this is provided free for the children and during the visit all teachers and staff are free to join a group or wander round and then enjoy a drink and some home baking.
